1.6. Stables

Horses will be stabled (1st bedding included – shavings) on the show grounds from 05/09/2025 12 am to at latest 8/09/2025 12 a: The necessary number of boxes has to be ordered when handing in the entries. If no boxes have been ordered, the OC will reserve one box per horse entered. Hay is included, shavings can be bought at the site.

1.8. VETERINARY MATTERS

2.1. HEALTH REQUIREMENTS

General

In accordance with the Code of Conduct for the Welfare of the Horse it is imperative that all horses at events are physically fit and free from infectious disease before being allowed to compete.

2.2. NATIONAL REQUIREMENTS

2.3. INJURY SURVEILLANCE

Horses participating in WAWE Events are subject to injury surveillance protocols; and in the event of fatality, a post mortem examination.

2.4. TRANSPORT OF HORSES

Horses must be fit to travel and be transported in suitable vehicles. Any government requirements for disease testing and control must be requested well in advance, to ensure that the horse is in compliance by the time of arrival at the border of the country where the event is taking place. Athletes, or their representatives, have the responsibility to comply with national legislation in both their country of origin and the host nation of the event. Where necessary athletes must contact local government authorities or veterinary advisors for information regarding animal health requirements and transport legislation. Within the European Union (EU), this includes EU Council Regulation (EC) No 1/2005 concerning the protection of animals during transport within the Member States of the EU.

2.5. VACCINATIONS - EQUINE INFLUENZA

Horses competing at international FEI Events must comply with the requirements for Equine Influenza vaccination in accordance with the Veterinary Regulations and as summarized below:

| VACCINATION | PROTOCOL | ELIGIBILITY TO ENTER VENUE |

| Primary Course | 1st Vaccination: | day 0 May compete 7 days after the 2nd Vaccination |
| THE REPORT OF THE PARTY OF THE | 2nd Vaccination: | day 21-92 |
| First Booster | Within 7 months of the 2nd vaccination of the Primary Course | May compete for 6 months +21 days after the 2 nd vaccination of the Primary Course Must not compete in the 7 days after receiving a Vaccination |
| Boosters | MINIMUM: within one year of previous booster vaccination IF COMPETING: must be in the 6 months +21 days of the booster previous vaccination | Must have been vaccinated within 6 months +21 days before arriving at the Event Must not compete in the 7 days after receiving a Vaccination |

All Horses intending to compete at the Event must be vaccinated against Equine Influenza in accordance with these VRs. The exception being if the applicable domestic legislation prevents the use of Equine Influenza vaccines within the relevant territory

2.6. HORSE INSPECTIONS

All horses will be assessed for their fitness to compete during the Horse Inspection. Any horse demonstrating questionable fitness may be referred to the Holding Box for further veterinary examination. Horses not deemed fit to compete by the Inspection Panel will not be permitted to compete. all horses must undergo an examination by a veterinarian to confirm their identification from their passport and micro-chip ID (where present), their vaccination status and general health. To protect all horses attending events, any horse with a questionable health status concerning vaccination, disease or other concerns, must be stabled within the isolation facilities provided by the Organizing Committee pending a decision on entering the venue

3. ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

3.1. INSURANCES AND NATIONAL REQUIREMENTS

Horse sport is associated with dangerous risks. The organizer of this tournaments shall NOT be liable for material and property damages or injuries of any kind whatsoever in the case of participants, owners, assistants and spectators who are in connection with the organizer.

The organizer expressly excludes all liability.

3.2. ATHLETES, OWNERS AND SUPPORT PERSONNEL

3.2.1. Personal Accident and Health Insurance

It is your responsibility as an Athlete/Owner/Support Personnel to ensure that you have adequate personal accident insurance in place to cover your participation at Events and in particular to insure against any personal injury or medical expenses arising from an accident, injury or illness which may occur at an. Event.

You should check with your National Federation to confirm if your National Federation's insurance policy (if any) covers personal accidents and/or illnesses which may occur when you are attending at/participating in Events.

If your National Federation does not have a personal accident/health insurance policy or if the National Federation's insurance policy does not cover personal accident or health claims, then you should obtain your own personal accident and health insurance policy to cover your attendance/participation at Events.

3.2.2. Personal Property Insurance

You should also ensure that you are insured against property loss, theft or damage which may occur at an Event. Again, the advice is to check with your National Federation to confirm if they have an insurance policy in place which would cover you in case of such property loss, theft or damage. If not, then you should obtain your own personal property insurance to cover such situations.

3.3. ATHLETES AND OWNERS

3.3.1. Third Party Liability Insurance

As an athlete/owner you are personally responsible for damages to third parties caused by you, your employees, support personnel, your agents or your horses. You are, therefore, strongly advised to take out third-party liability insurance providing full coverage in relation to WAWE Events at home and abroad, and to keep the policy up to date. The Organizer will NOT be responsible for any damage caused to third parties by you, your employees, support personnel, your agents or your horses

3.3.2. Additional Liability Information

The organizer declines any liability for property or pecuniary damage which may happen to visitors, athletes, grooms and horse owners through slight negligence of the organizer, his delegates or his assistants. The OC is liable in case of intent, gross negligence as well as in case of injury to life, body or health and in further cases he is liable for compelling legal liability acc. to the legal requirements.

3.3.3. Horse Insurance

As an owner you should ensure that your Horses are adequately insured against any injuries or illnesses they may sustain while participating at an Event.

4. PROTESTS/APPEALS

To be valid, all Protests and Appeals must be made in writing and accompanied by a deposit of € 100.-.

5. ADDITIONAL INFORMATION FROM THE ORGANISER

5.1. Regulations: Actual valid WAWE Rules

5.1. GERMAN ANIMAL WELFARE ACT

According to paragraph 6 of the German Animal Welfare Act, trimming the vibrissae around eyes and muzzle as well as clipping or cutting the hairs inside the ears of horses are prohibited.

5.2. Horses

The horses must be marked with bridle numbers at all times on the event grounds.

5.3. Athletes

For all athletes under the age of 18, helmets are required on the event grounds.

5.4. Dogs

Dogs have to be kept on the leash.
