12 VETERINARY MATTERS

12.1 HEALTH REQUIREMENTS

General

In accordance with the Code of Conduct for the Welfare of the Horse it is imperative that all horses at events are physically fit and free from infectious disease before being allowed to compete.

Entry of horses

Required health tests and vaccinations: ./.

Every athlete is obliged to deliver all necessary health certificates for the transport to the event or identification of the horses before they come into the stables:

In case of arrival from a EU-member-country, a health attestation for registered horses acc. to sample of Annex II to COUNCIL DIRECTIVE 2009/156/EC

(see <http://eurlex.europa.eu/legal-content/EN/TXT/PDF/?uri=CELEX:32009L0156&from=DE>) of the currently valid version will be necessary.

In case of arrival from a country not belonging to the EU, a health certificate for registered horses acc. to sample of Annex II (see https://www.bmel.de/DE/Tier/Tierhandel/Transport/Gesundheitsbescheinigungen/_texte/Pferde.html) of the decision of the commission 92/260/EG of the currently valid version will be necessary.

A certificate must be done in at least one official language of the country of destination and in one official language of the member country. The athlete must carry with him the original certificate, not a copy.

The Organiser sees to it that on the competition site, an official state veterinarian is present to issue the health certificates which are necessary for the transport of the horses to their destination abroad.

In case the OC has entrusted a forwarding agency, the latter is ready to assist regarding the required documents.

Furthermore, questions relating to health requirements for horses can be directed to the veterinary authorities in the country of origin or in Germany.

12.2 NATIONAL REQUIREMENTS

12.3 INJURY SURVEILLANCE

Horses participating in WAWE Events are subject to injury surveillance protocols; and in the event of fatality, a post mortem examination.

12.4 TRANSPORT OF HORSES

Horses must be fit to travel and be transported in suitable vehicles. Any government requirements for disease testing and control must be requested well in advance, to ensure that the horse is in compliance by the time of arrival at the border of the country where the event is taking place. Athletes, or their representatives, have the responsibility to comply with national legislation in both their country of origin and the host nation of the event. Where necessary athletes must contact local government authorities or veterinary advisors for information regarding animal health requirements and transport legislation. Within the European Union (EU), this includes EU Council Regulation (EC) No 1/2005 concerning the protection of animals during transport within the Member States of the EU.

12.5 VENUE ARRIVAL INFORMATION & FITNESS TO COMPETE

12.5.1 Passports

For horses permanently resident in a Member State of the European Union: all horses must have a national EU passport in compliance with EU Regulations.

12.5.2 VACCINATIONS – EQUINE INFLUENZA

Horses competing at international FEI Events must comply with the requirements for Equine Influenza vaccination in accordance with the Veterinary Regulations and as summarized below:

VACCINATION	PROTOCOL	ELIGIBILITY TO ENTER VENUE
Primary Course	1 st Vaccination: 2 nd Vaccination:	day 0 May compete 7 days after the 2 nd Vaccination day 21-92
First Booster	Within 7 months of the 2nd vaccination of the Primary Course	May compete for 6 months +21 days after the 2 nd vaccination of the Primary Course Must not compete in the 7 days after receiving a Vaccination
Boosters	MINIMUM: within one year of previous booster vaccination IF COMPETING: must be in the 6 months +21 days of the booster previous vaccination	Must have been vaccinated within 6 months +21 days before arriving at the Event Must not compete in the 7 days after receiving a Vaccination

All Horses intending to compete at the Event must be vaccinated against Equine Influenza in accordance with these VRs. The exception being if the applicable domestic legislation prevents the use of Equine Influenza vaccines within the relevant territory

12.5.3 EXAMINATION ON ARRIVAL

On arrival at an Event venue, all horses must undergo an examination by a veterinarian to confirm their identification from their passport and micro-chip ID (where present), their vaccination status and general health. To protect all horses attending events, any horse with a questionable health status concerning vaccination, disease or other concerns, must be stabled within the isolation facilities provided by the Organizing Committee pending a decision on entering the venue.

12.5.4 HORSE INSPECTIONS

All horses will be assessed for their fitness to compete during the Horse Inspection. Any horse demonstrating questionable fitness may be referred to the Holding Box for further veterinary examination. Horses not deemed fit to compete by the Inspection Panel will not be permitted to compete.

12.5.5 LIMB SENSITIVITY EXAMINATION

All horses are subject to examination under the protocol for abnormal limb sensitivity throughout the period of an Event, including, but not limited to, between rounds. Horses may be examined once or on multiple occasions during the Period of an Event. Horses may be selected for examination under the protocol randomly or they may be targeted. All horses selected to be tested must submit promptly to the examination or are subject to immediate disqualification. There is no obligation to examine any specific number of horses at an event.

12.6 EQUINE ANTI-DOPING AND CONTROLLED MEDICATION PROGRAMME (EADCM)

12.6.1 SAMPLING

All horses competing at WAWE Events may be subject to sampling for the presence Equine Prohibited Substances in accordance with the Equine Anti-Doping and Controlled Medication Regulations (EADCMRs). Horses may be selected for sampling in accordance with obligatory testing, targeted or random sampling procedures.

12.6.2 ELECTIVE TESTING

Elective Testing may be carried out prior to an Event to check for the presence of prohibited substances. Please refer to <http://inside.fei.org/fei/your-role/veterinarians> for information and details.

13 HUMAN ANTI-DOPING

Athletes can be tested at any WAWE Event, by the WAWE or by other Anti-Doping Organizations with testing jurisdiction.

14 ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

14.1 INSURANCES AND NATIONAL REQUIREMENTS

Horse sport is associated with dangerous risks. The organizer of this tournaments shall NOT be liable for material and property damages or injuries of any kind whatsoever in the case of participants, owners, assistants and spectators who are in connection with the organizer.

The organizer expressly excludes all liability.

14.1.1 ATHLETES, OWNERS AND SUPPORT PERSONNEL

14.1.1.1 Personal Accident and Health Insurance

It is your responsibility as an Athlete/Owner/Support Personnel to ensure that you have adequate personal accident insurance in place to cover your participation at Events and in particular to insure against any personal injury or medical expenses arising from an accident, injury or illness which may occur at an Event.

You should check with your National Federation to confirm if your National Federation's insurance policy (if any) covers personal accidents and/or illnesses which may occur when you are attending at/participating in Events.

If your National Federation does not have a personal accident/health insurance policy or if the National Federation's insurance policy does not cover personal accident or health claims, then you should obtain your own personal accident and health insurance policy to cover your attendance/participation at Events.

14.1.1.2 Personal Property Insurance

You should also ensure that you are insured against property loss, theft or damage which may occur at an Event. Again, the advice is to check with your National Federation to confirm if they have an insurance policy in place which would cover you in case of such property loss, theft or damage. If not, then you should obtain your own personal property insurance to cover such situations.

14.1.2 ATHLETES AND OWNERS

14.1.2.1 Third Party Liability Insurance

As an athlete/owner you are personally responsible for damages to third parties caused by you, your employees, support personnel, your agents or your horses. You are, therefore, strongly advised to take out third-party liability insurance providing full coverage in relation to WAWE Events at home and abroad, and to keep the policy up to date. The Organizer will NOT be responsible for any damage caused to third parties by you, your employees, support personnel, your agents or your horses

14.1.2.2 Additional Liability Information

The organizer declines any liability for property or pecuniary damage which may happen to visitors, athletes, grooms and horse owners through slight negligence of the organizer, his delegates or his assistants. The OC is liable in case of intent, gross negligence as well as in case of injury to life, body or health and in further cases he is liable for compelling legal liability acc. to the legal requirements.

14.1.2.3 Horse Insurance

As an owner you should ensure that your Horses are adequately insured against any injuries or illnesses they may sustain while participating at an Event.

14.2 PROTESTS/APPEALS

To be valid, all Protests and Appeals must be made in writing and accompanied by a deposit of € 100.-.

14.3 Disputes

In the event of any discussion concerning the interpretation of the schedule (in translated languages), the English version will be decisive.

14.4 MODIFICATION TO SCHEDULE

In exceptional circumstances, together with the approval of the WAWE Board of Directors and the Ground Jury, the OC may change the schedule in order to clarify any matters arising from an omission or due to unforeseen circumstances. Any such changes must be notified to all athletes and officials as soon as possible.

14.5 ADDITIONAL INFORMATION FROM THE ORGANISER

14.5.1 Regulations

14.5.3 GERMAN ANIMAL WELFARE ACT

According to paragraph 6 of the German Animal Welfare Act, trimming the vibrissae around eyes and muzzle as well as clipping or cutting the hairs inside the ears of horses are prohibited.

14.5.4 Horses

The horses must be marked with bridle numbers at all times on the event grounds.

14.5.5 Athletes

For all athletes under the age of 18, helmets are required on the event grounds.

It is generally recommended to wear a helmet.

14.5.6 Dogs

Dogs have to be kept on the leash.
